On a given day, a studio of modern makers may be required to manually cut threads on a brass detail in the morning while at midday apply a studio developed antique patina to the very same part. While the lacquer cures into a durable protective coating on the newly patinated parts they then might put down their hand tools to continue the work in the digital space. This could be creating an approval drawing of a custom design to send to a client, photographing a recently completed fixture, or 3D modeling a new detail which will then be 3D Printed overnight, ready for assembly as a scaled mockup the following morning when the modern makers return to their pattern of process and production.


This broad range of disciplines is one we readily and happily embrace at Trella. It informs every facet of our work, at a multitude of scales and provides the problem solving skills and designer insight needed to bring a project together as a whole.

But our process is not all rigor and discipline as craft often demands. Also essential and highly satisfying to our process is play and experimentation. Many of our staple specialty finishes were born from the loose art of playful discovery. In our studio, it is not uncommon find one of us casting pewter into various hand tamped sand molds, experimenting with a new patina mixture, or screwing together a handful of old parts in the hopes of stumbling upon a new idea. Many times our efforts are fruitless, but there are times when we discover a detail, texture, or color that we find beautiful and choose to develop further and celebrate its character with a new product. One example of this is our signature Prussian Blue patina developed for its application on the Benedict Pendant.

This book serves as a look inside our process, as well as a glimpse into the wide range of possibilities our made to order studio model has to offer. The light fixtures, material samples and images you see throughout this book were created from 2015 to 2022 at Trella's studios in Brooklyn, NY and Central NJ. Credit and thanks must be given to our valued past and present employees for their dedication to their craft, as well as our essential vendors in the tri-state region.



PRUSSIAN BLUE


Trella's signature Prussian Blue patina was developed in Trella's Brooklyn workshop in 2017 and has since been applied to a wide range of products in our collection. This specialty finish is one that develops its color, texture, and character through a process that relies on a quick direct application of patina followed by patience and timing. It is a process that once started, cannot be adjusted or altered during its natural development. The custom made patina is applied to raw brass and left to sit for hours as the transformation takes place. At the right moment, the components are then air dried and sealed with a clear lacquer to capture the desired color once it has been reached.





BENEDICT PENDANT

The Benedict Pendant celebrates the defining detail of the Benedict Series. Two nested spun hemispheres cradle a hand blown glass globe. This fixture lends itself to creative configuration of our many finishes meaning its sure to be a stunning accent in any space.

BENEDICT SEVEN LIGHT CHANDELIER + AMBROSE COCKTAIL TABLE


The Benedict Chandelier showcases matte white powder-coat shades and blackened brass details.




6" BENEDICT PENDANT



Antique Brass


